Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)

A PPE program should address the hazard(s) present; the selection, maintenance, and use of PPE; the training of employees; and monitoring of the program to ensure its ongoing effectiveness. All personal protective equipment should be safely designed and constructed, be maintained in a clean and reliable fashion, and properly stored when not in use. PPE should fit comfortably, encouraging worker use it at all times.

Uncontrolled Hazards Which May Require PPE

- EYE projectiles, dust, chemical splashes, steam, molten metals, and light radiation
- HAND heat, cuts, abrasions, puncture, contact with chemicals
- **HEAD** falling objects, projectiles, low headroom, or sharp edges overhead
- FOOT falling objects, chemical contact, puncture, slippery floors
- LUNGS dust, vapors, steam, lack of oxygen
- **NOISE** consistently loud noise, impulse or impact noise

With few exceptions, OSHA now requires employers to pay for personal protective equipment used to comply with OSHA standards. The standard makes clear that employers cannot require workers to provide their own PPE and when a worker provides his or her own PPE, the employer must ensure that the equipment is adequate to protect the worker from hazards at the workplace.
